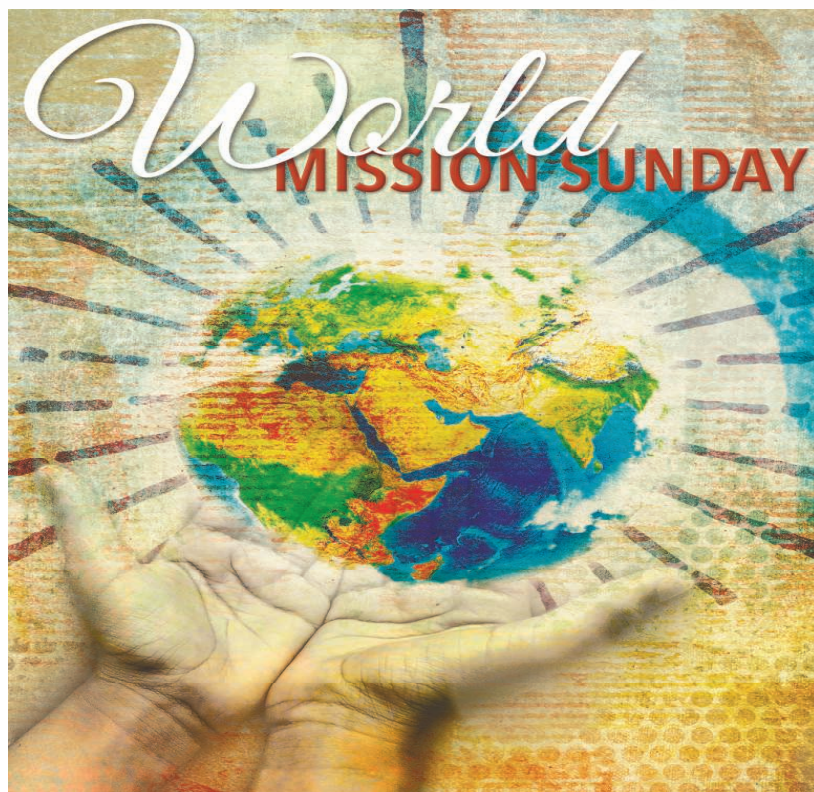

On Catholic Cardinals

You may or may not have heard in the news that on Sunday, October 9, Pope Francis created seventeen new Cardinals including three from the United States. This is the third time that the Holy Father has created cardinals since being elected as Pope in March 2013. However, this is the first time that Americans have been created in the consistory of the creation of new cardinals by Pope Francis. A consistory is a solemn meeting of all cardinals that is convoked and presided by the Holy Father.

What does this all mean to the average Catholic? Perhaps not a lot, but then again, there is a direction that the Holy Father is leading the Catholic Church. All three consistories have included men from all around the world including some Archdioceses that have never had a cardinal. Before Pope Francis' reign, a smaller Archdiocese would never have a Cardinal, while through the years, it was a given that the Archbishop or Bishop would be elevated to a cardinal.

Cardinals in the Catholic Church have been around for a long time. It wasn't until the twelfth century that the practice of appointing cardinals outside of Rome began. Moreover, Italy had the majority of cardinals, which is being reduced in recent years by the Popes. Until 1917, when the new Code of Canon Law came out, anyone could become a cardinal, however eventually that individual would be ordained a priest. After 1917, in order to be made a cardinal, one needed at least to be a priest. When the revised Code of Canon Law came out in 1983, it became a requirement that one be a bishop or archbishop before being created a cardinal.

From what I know, there are three types of cardinals: one is governing an Archdiocese, or works in the Curia (Administrative body of the Vatican), or has been given the title as an honor. In the case of being created a cardinal as an honor, they are most often over the age of eighty and therefore cannot vote in a conclave, the time when there is an election of a new Holy Father.

Besides wearing a red hat, Cardinals are senior church leaders and are considered a prince of the Catholic Church. Furthermore, until they reach the age of eighty, they can vote for a new Pope, which happens in the Sistine Chapel inside the Vatican.

Who are some of the new cardinals created on October 9? Of the seventeen, thirteen are eligible to vote. Most of the new cardinals are in their sixties or seventies, with the youngest being forty-nine years of age; he is now the Archbishop of Bangui, Central African Republic. Another person created as a cardinal is Archbishop Maurice Piat of Port Louis, Mauritius, an island in the Indian Ocean, 1,200 miles from the SE coast of the African Continent. That was unexpected. As mentioned above, there are three bishops from the USA in this consistory. One is Bishop Kevin Joseph Farrell, from Dallas, who was just appointed the prefect (Head Person) of the Dicastery (Department) for the Laity, Families and Life in the Vatican. Another Archbishop named cardinal was Blasé Cupich of Chicago. This honor was expected. It was also expected that the Archbishops of Los Angeles and Philadelphia would be created Cardinals but they were not. Last, it was a complete surprise to hear that Archbishop Joseph William Tobin of Indianapolis was created cardinal, and not only have they never had a cardinal, but also the Archdiocese is a small one. Once again, Pope Francis has amazed the Catholic world by creating some Archbishops and bishops who never would have been imagined being created a prince of the Catholic Church.

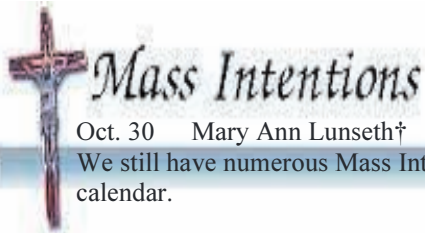
SACRED HEART OFFICE HELP NEEDED
