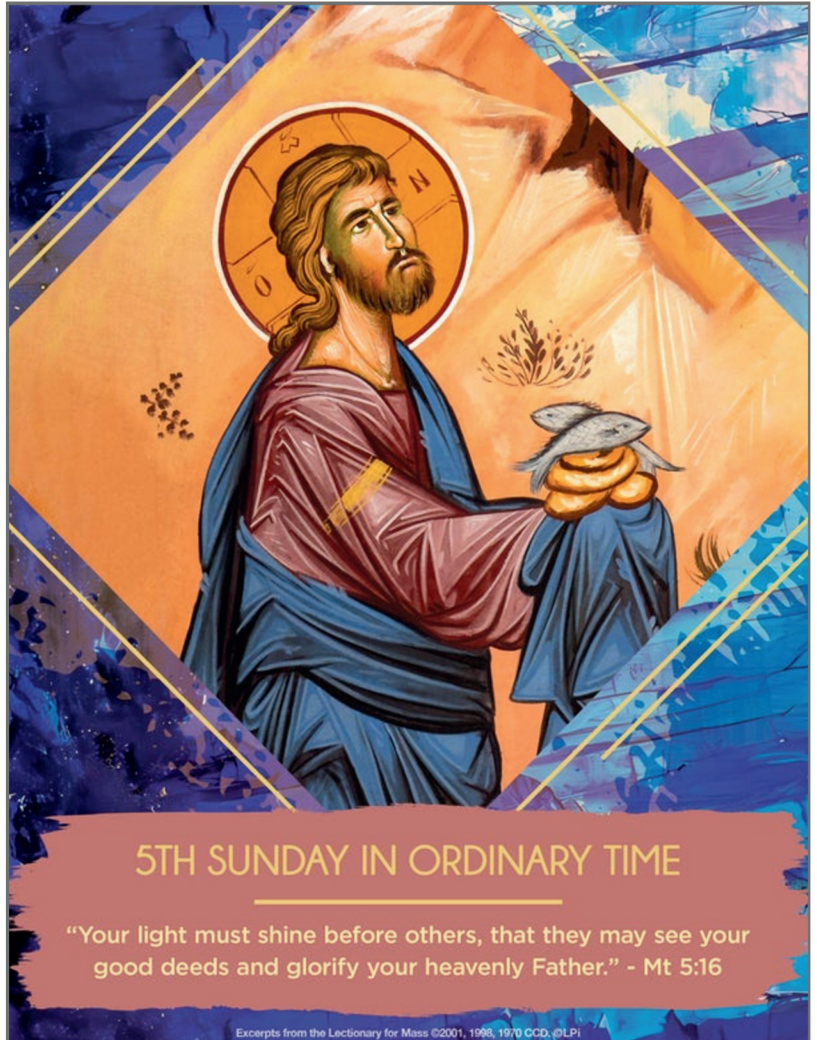

LENT 2026

Ash Wednesday is February 18th this year, so we have arrived at the penitential season of Lent. You don't have to look very far to see that we need Lent. For example, according to one index called the Hofstede Scale of Individualism, the United States is the most individualistic society in the world (91 out of a possible 100). Americans are also very indulgent as a society; this can be seen even in our pets—over half of our dogs and cats are obese.

Our Lenten penance can involve giving up something—both food or drink but also screens. However, we should look to replace it with good activities. Sacred Heart continues its tradition of Lenten soup suppers on Fridays at 6 p.m. Both parishes have Stations of the Cross at 7 p.m. on pretty much every Friday. One exception is the Living Stations of the Cross performed by the St. Gregory's youth at 5 p.m. on March 27th (and stay for the Knights of Columbus' Fish Sandwich and Ham Bingo). For our 4th annual Walking Stations of the Cross on Good Friday (April 3rd), we will meet at the former movie theater of Tangier Outlet Mall in North Branch.

The healing powers of the Sacrament of Reconciliation are available throughout the year, but it takes on a greater focus in Lent. I get asked to help out at other parishes' reconciliation services. We add opportunities at our parishes, including the following:

- KIC students (at St. Gregory's)—during class on March 4th
- Sacred Heart (drop-in)—Tuesday, March 24th from 5 to 6:30 p.m.
- St. Gregory's (service with individual confessions)—Tuesday, March 31st at 6:30 p.m.

The parishes' Lenten book will be *Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy* by Matthew Kelly. The author says, "I was living my life like a Ferrari with no brakes." We all face a schedule that is full of urgent things, but we can discover joy if we intentionally choose to slow down a bit and prioritize our faith. Look for these books in the back of church near the start of Lent.

Lent is the 2-year anniversary of the start of parish small groups at Sacred Heart and St. Gregory's. God has given the local Church in these times the great opportunity to journey in faith together with others from their community. I remind you that it is Archbishop Hebda's vision (and mine as well) of every parishioner belonging to a parish small group. A person can be a good disciple without belonging to a parish small group; however, the other people in a small group are well-equipped to support that person than a Sunday homily from a priest ministering to hundreds of households. I encourage you to just try one out for Lent; no long-term commitment is necessary. For the current small groups, please contact the parish office or talk with me.

Wishing you and your household a blessed Lent.
